



Backyard Bohemian Takes the APLD Award at the 2016 San Francisco Flower & Garden Show

Every year at the San Francisco Flower & Garden Show, the APLD award is given to the display garden that best demonstrates plant knowledge, design skill, creativity, sustainability, and suitability for the hypothetical owner. This practical requirement distinguishes the APLD award, and is reflective of our members' focus on shaping gardens and landscapes that demonstrate a thoughtful and holistic approach to outdoor living and design.

Winning designer Leslie McKenna—of **McKenna Landscape**, a design/build firm based in Los Gatos—included beautifully balanced and layered plantings surrounding serene, intimate patios.

"Of all of the awards, we were pleased to earn those most applicable to what we try to achieve. Even though these are exhibition gardens, we try to incorporate elements that people can apply in their own yards. The APLD and Sunset Western Garden Living awards validate that approach," said Leslie McKenna.

The garden demonstrated the importance of structural color, bold fabrics, and use of permeable paving materials. A clever, niched screening wall separated two romantic seating areas. A sumptuously colorful settee invited napping. A second area incorporated a small fountain, dramatic pendant lighting, and a portable industrial "coffee table" on wheels. A patterned brick "carpet", lain in gravel, completed each of these engaging, achievable small garden rooms.

This family collaboration resulted in a playful yet tranquil space for an active family. Eric McKenna, Leslie's father, founded the company in 1980. Nancy McKenna, Leslie's mother, soon joined as the Office Manager, and Leslie now represents a second generation of design. APLD celebrates the McKenna family achievement, and their garden, which offered respite and inspiration to many.

APLD Display Garden Plant Combinations by Lawn—Long Ago Designer, Anna Wendorf

Yucca, Myrsine africana, Heuchera 'Peach Flambe,' Heuchera 'Miracle'

When Billy Goodnick—a blogger about gardens and plants—led a tour through our garden, this plant combination was the first he pointed out. A variegated Yucca called attention to the entrance of our front garden with its bold spiky leaves. It was set against a dark green Myrsine africana hedge for contrast in texture and color. Heuchera 'Peach Flambe' and Heuchera' Miracle' packed the front of the bed for subtle reds and greens. Billy pointed out how the red of the Heuchera 'Peach Flambe'

was repeated in the burgundy stems of the Myrsine and how the red and green of the Heuchera 'Miracle' pulled it all together. When not in a garden show bed, try replacing the Yucca with more Heuchera compatible plants for similar effect. Dianella 'Yellow Stripe' or Liriope would give you strappy leaves in part shade.

Ceanothus 'Skylark' and Berberis darwinii

For some reason, Berberis darwinii gets little attention when people select shrubs for deer and drought tolerant yards—perhaps because of its prickly personality. But when visitors came through our garden, the golden flowers spilling over the planter drew everyone over to admire them. The soft blue of the Ceanothus complimented the yellow in texture and color. These two would be very suitable garden companions.


Eriphyllum nevinii (Catalina Silverlace)

San Diego District Spring Home and Garden Show Entry

Once again the San Diego District hosted the show entry for the Del Mar Spring Home/Garden show. We have been doing this for a few years now. Our district has become known for the 30-minute consultations for \$30 and they are quite popular with the attendees. Some consultation appointments are made on line through Brown Paper ticket sales and some homeowners sign up when they come to the show.

Local residents are encouraged to bring photos and rough drawings of their properties to the consultations to help guide our designers with ideas for their projects. Grevillea thelemanniana 'Baby'

Spider Net Grevillea

This is one of my new favorite plants. *Grevillea thelemanniana* 'Baby' is an Australian native that occurs naturally in wintermoist sandy soils but has proven quite adaptable to central San Diego clay soils and gardens. Its leggy, sprawling habit make it perfect on hillsides, where it spills over retaining walls or in pots.

I've seen it get a whole 12" tall while spreading up to 4 ft in width. Small masses of red/orange flowers are held tight, adorning the plant nearly all year in our mild climate. After they display, they disappear almost instantly, once they've fallen into mulch.

I especially like to combine 'Baby' with Anigozanthus, Protea or Westringa to round out its drought tolerant beauty.





PlantRight's 2016 List of Suggested Alternatives for Invasive Garden Plants in California


It is a rare garden designer, contractor, or maintenance person who has never specified, planted, or contended in some way with confusion or concern over horticultural invasives like *Nassella tenuissima* (Mexican Feather Grass), *Pennisetum setaceum* (Green Fountain Grass), or just a little bit of *Vinca major* (Periwinkle).

Few of us can dispute the beauty and even the seeming utility of these plants, which were introduced, spread, and displayed by us. But now we know better, and we know what to do. It's never too late to say "no" to Mexican Feather Grass, "G'bye" to Green Fountain Grass, and "I'll pass" on the Periwinkle. With these alternatives, you won't even miss these plants, which at first seemed stable, but turned out to have "issues".

Welcome to the new list, offering 34 reliable alternatives to the usual suspects, all of whom need to go into retirement. PlantRight reports that the impressive list of plants no longer found in nursery surveys has grown to an impressive 15 species like Capeweed, Scotch Broom, Russian Olive, and so many more. (See the Retirement List here.) These plants are still invasive, but thanks to voluntary industry efforts, they are falling away from the marketplace. **more**






