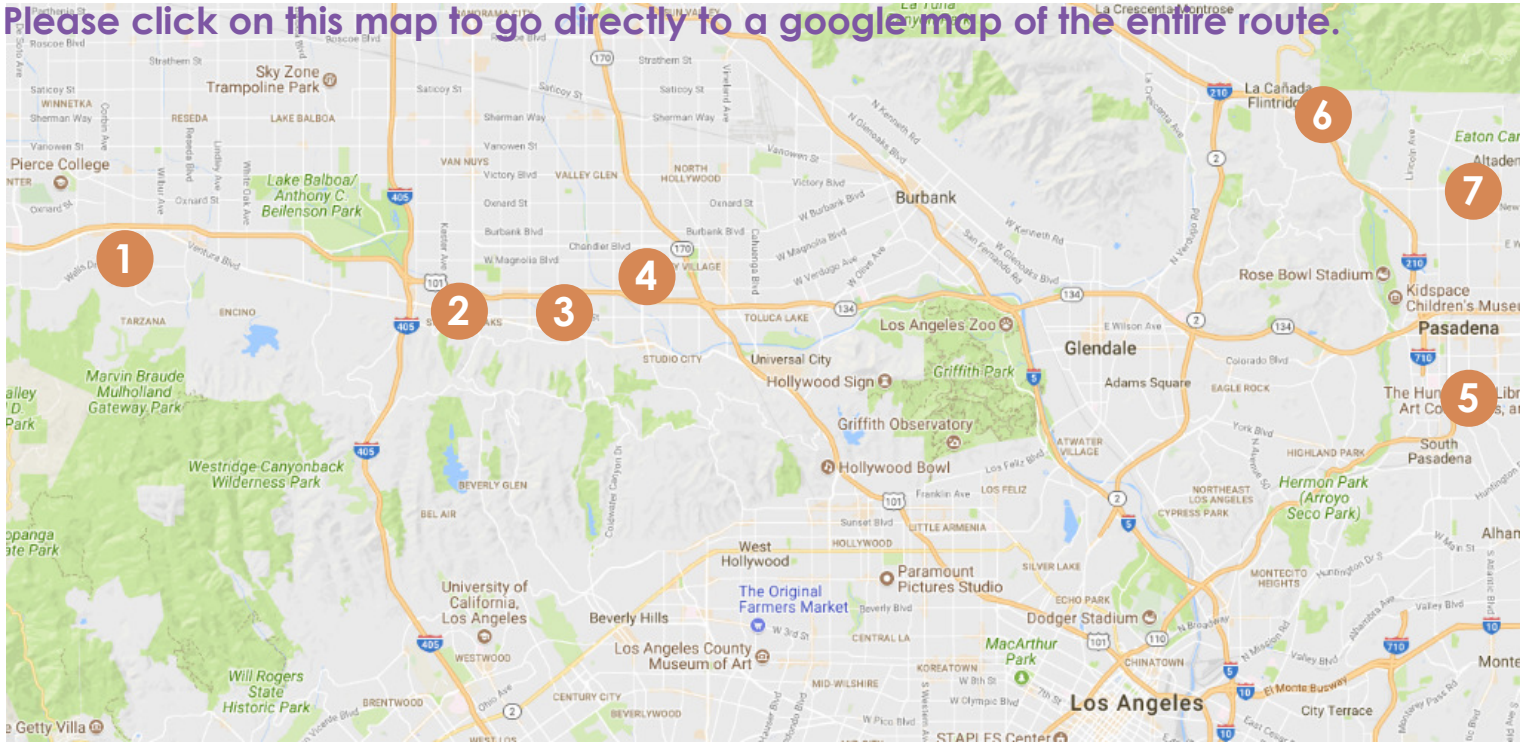

Sunny Curb Appeal

4968 Calvin Avenue, Tarzana, CA 91356



This garden's front yard was mostly turf with a small walkway off the driveway to the front door. All of the 1,605 square feet of turf was removed for a new street entry and climate appropriate plantings. The LADWP rebate was used. The new front entry steps at the street entry, walkways and driveway are colored infused concrete with a brushed finish. The roof runoff is collected at the right downspout, the flow going to the rain garden where it can percolate into the soil, the overflow goes into a drain in the gravel under the rock at the end of the blue river stone. The rain garden was positioned to allow deep water to the Purple Leaf Plum that was struggling to get enough moisture with the turf grass. The irrigation technology used is drip controller by a smart Irrigation controller the brand of controller used is Rain Machine which is WIFI connected. The Pink Trumpet trees were placed to give the house shade in the summer once they are full grown, they flower first in Spring.

Woodland Shade Garden
by Johanna Woolcott of Wild Gardens
14730 Sutton Street, Sherman Oaks, CA 91403



The goal was to create a more welcoming and sustainable entrance to the property. Creating a woodland garden to balance the existing large trees and add privacy. Over 2300' of grass was removed. Quality compost and worm casings helped us create good soil nutrients and permeability to help speed the removal of years of grass roots. In addition, we created over 114 linear feet of dry creek beds to sink and infiltrate the water runoff from property. The excavation of the dry creek beds and their berms added undulations to the previously flat yard. The garden uses a colorful combination of California native, Australian and other climate appropriate plants. The existing mature Camellias and azaleas were hydro-zoned separately. A simple water feature brings a steady stream of fauna for a drink. Now a Certified Wild Life habitat, the yard is alive with activity. The front yard was once just a pass thru, now is much enjoyed family gathering area.

Phase II: A plan to address water runoff in the back yard

Habitat Inviting Front Yard
by Jacky Surber of Urbafloria
4151 Longridge Ave, Sherman Oaks, CA 91423



A traditional front yard was reimagined, in Fall 2015, as an beautiful habitat garden. The soil was prepared with organic compost and shaped into gently sloping berms and swales to keep rainwater on site. Bird feeders and a recirculating water feature were installed, now constantly visited by birds.

California native plants were mixed with existing shrubs to support wildlife. To give the illusion of a lawn, an Australian ground cover, *Myoporum parvifolium*, was planted in the center of the garden along the entry path; chosen for its bright green color, low water needs, tolerance of light foot traffic and part shade. Other climate appropriate plants were later added by the homeowners. All plants are watered by drip irrigation and surrounded with a healthy layer of mulch.

A new brick pathway to the front door ties in with the existing porch, previously the driveway was the only entry point. In order for the homeowners to sit and enjoy the space with their small dogs, a white picket fence was constructed, which ties in perfectly with the architecture of this old home.

Sustainable / Watershed Features:

Swales and berms, driveway cut, organic compost, mulch, native plants, drip irrigation

Blue Bayou

The back yard was predominantly patchy turf around old citrus trees and a pool. The clients' wish list was long: pool party and play areas, kitchen garden and gathering spaces with a cozy fire. An outdoor cooking and dining space was important, as were new pool decking and equipment. Somewhere along the way we added a cabana with outdoor shower, changing room, and facilities amenable to pool party use. New design transformed the traditional kidney shaped pool as both a reflecting pond and oasis-like lagoon. Full-color bluestone patios and stepping stones break up hardscape. Two new *Butia capitata* palms anchor the oasis effect. Blue fence paint mirrors the pool, diffusing its edges. Design lines remain fluid on this project; the seating area echo's the curvilinear pool shape, as does the fire pit. We reduced the lawn area and replaced it with a watersaving native mow-free variety. Plantings around the pool and perimeter include dry tropical plants to further reduce water use. In this way we use our water budget for the vegetables and fruit trees.

Sustainable / Watershed Features:

Re-direction of rain water from hardscape and roof to landscape areas
Planting of native and nectar-rich plants
Soil building with compost and compost tea

Formal Rain Garden

The front yard was mostly a field of 50' tall palm trees and their messy litter. Instead of sending them all to the landfill, we cut them down and buried them in under a berm. This added instant privacy to the front yard, while we wait for the new trees and shrubs to grow in. While it decomposes it will act like a sponge, absorbing and storing water during the wet winter and releasing it to the young plants all year, as needed. Rain is collected from the backyard patio swale and the new roof gutters. It flows down rain chains, into catch basins, and then underground into the formal

front yard rain garden. Built with materials already on-site, this fills and quickly drains during storms. Water migrates underground to the palm berm and into the surrounding soil sponge and plants.

Sustainable / Watershed Features:

Rain water harvesting (roof & patio drain into formal rain garden), hugelkultur/ composting in place (and avoiding landfill trip for palms), mostly locally California native plants (habitat), shrubs and trees, efficient drip line irrigation, low-water/low-maintenance UC Verde Buffalo Grass lawn, organic soil maintenance (compost tea & mulch), LED landscape lighting, permeable gravel walkways, all soil kept/ used on site.

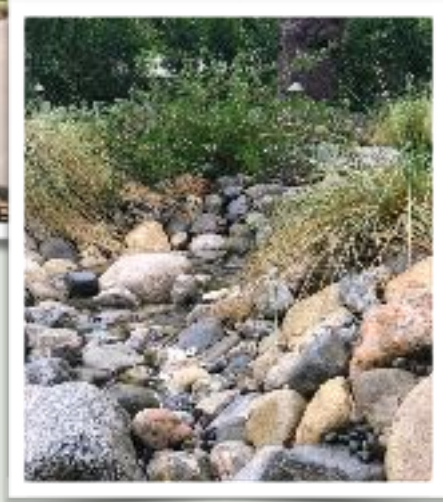

Native Splendor Under Oaks

Dead grass, old tired shrubs, and narrow brick paths were removed to create an inviting and traversable front yard garden characterized by a set of mature Coast Live Oaks. To allow deep soaking rainfall to work its way into the soil and root systems, rain water from the roof is diverted into a long, deep basin filled with local river cobbles and planted with seasonal grasses and California native shrubs and perennials, creating a lovely focal point in the garden. Near the house, a seasonal display of color and texture is provided with a layered planting of sun-loving plants well-suited to our climate. Happy under the dry shade of the Oaks are a selection of California native plants.

Rain from rooftop diverts into deep river rock-filled basin

A Landscape to Inspire the Neighborhood

About 14 cubic yards of soil was brought in to contour the landscape and a large tree that leaned toward the house, disrupted the neighbor's driveway and distorted the growth of the Cedrus deodara was removed--allowing sunshine into the garden.

The high water lawn and shrubs were removed and an interesting dry stream was incorporated. I opened up the two shrubs that were left; the Vitex trifolia purpurea and the Duranta variegata that were pruned into balls and developed them into arching forms. An arbor for the Vitex was built to create interest for the side gate entry.

A combination of fast growing grasses and perennials with architectural plants provide year round interest and attract many birds
